THIS DECLARATION OF TRUST is made

this twentieth day of November One thousand nine hundred and seventy two by MONSIGNOR ADAM WROBEL of 22 Bute Street S.W.7. Kensington in the County of London Clergyman ZYGMUNT SZKOPIAK of 5 Beckwith Road S.E.24 in the County of London Lecturer and WALDEMAR MARIAN CEGLOWSKI of 195 Honor Oak Road S.E.23. in the County of London Company Director (hereinafter called "the Trustees")

W H E R E A S :

1. Certain persons hereinafter called "the subscribers" have given sums of money for the furtherance of the charitable objects hereinafter mentioned
2. By a resolution passed at a meeting of the subscribers held on the Tenth day of November One thousand nine hundred and seventy two it was resolved that the Trustees should be nominated as the original Trustees for the purpose of holding and applying the said subscriptions and any further subscriptions donations and bequests to be received in accordance with this Deed and that

should be the original members of the Committee hereinafter provided for and also that the draft of a Deed for carrying out the intentions of the subscribers and declaring the Trust Powers and provisions upon and subject to which the said subscriptions and donations should be held (being this Deed) should be approved

N O W THIS DEED W I T N E S S E T H :

1. THE Trustees hereby declare that they and the survivors or survivor of them or other Trustees or Trustee hereof for the time being will hold the said sums so subscribed as

aforesaid when the same shall be paid to them and all other subscriptions donations and bequests and other moneys or property as and when the same shall be paid to or vested in them and the moneys investments and property from time to time representing the same UPON TRUST to apply the same in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained for charitable purposes for the benefit of persons of Polish extraction (which shall be deemed to be persons who were born in Poland or one of whose parents or grandparents were born in Poland or persons who are or were married (a) to a person who was born in Poland or (b) to a person one of whose parents or grandparents were born in Poland) and their relatives (hereinafter called the "beneficiaries") residing permanently or temporarily in the London postal areas of South East 3, ~~4~~, 5, 6, 8, 10, 13, 14, 15, 18, 12, 21, 22, 23, 24, ~~26~~ and 27 being the area of the Polish Parish of Lewisham-Brockley (as at the time of execution of this Deed)

(1) The relief and assistance of the aged sick and disabled beneficiaries

(2) The advancement of the education of persons resident in the said Parish ✓

(3) The relief of poverty amongst the beneficiaries ✓

(4) The advancement of the Roman Catholic faith and Roman Catholic charitable institutions ✓

In furtherance of the above objects but not further or otherwise the Trustees shall have the following powers:-

(a) To make provisions for the maintenance of any school or other educational institution situate in the said Parish

(b) To provide scholarships for further education such scholarships to be awarded to persons resident in the Parish

(c) To provide lectures and films of an educational character for the benefit of persons resident in the said Parish

(d) To do all such other things as will further the above objects or any of them

2. THE Name of the Charity shall be Lewisham Polish Centre

3. THE Trustees shall deal with and dispose of the said money investments property and proceeds of sale and income rents and profits thereof in all respects in accordance with the directions of the Committee and in particular shall invest all or any part of such monies from time to time in such investments (including purchase of land for investment or occupation) as the Committee shall from time to time direct or place the same on deposit with a bank and shall be entitled to be indemnified out of the funds of the Charity against all liabilities in respect of such investment and property

4. THE Trustees shall if so directed by the Committee purchase, take on lease, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property and any rights and privileges which the Committee may think necessary for the purposes of the Charity and erect pull down rebuild enlarge alter and equip any premises ~~leased or purchased and shall permit the same to be used for the~~ purpose of the primary trust hereinbefore declared and on such terms as the Committee shall think fit and sell, grant leases or tenancies of, dispose of, or in any way turn to account all or any of the assets of the Charity for and without any consideration with a view to the promotion of its objects or any of them.

5. LAND or premises acquired hereunder shall be conveyed or assigned to the Trustees upon trust to sell the same with power to postpone such sale and to hold the net proceeds of sale and other capital moneys and the net rents and profits until sale upon trust and with and subject to the powers and provisions of this Deed. The Statutory Power to appoint new Trustees shall be expressed to apply to the Trust for sale declared by such conveyance or assignment and the Trustees shall be given power thereby to raise money by mortgage for any purpose such respective powers shall be exercised in accordance with the directions of the Committee but no purchaser or mortgagee shall be concerned to see that any such directions have been given. The proceeds of sale of such land or premises shall be applicable

either as capital or income for the general purpose of the said primary trust as the Committee shall from time to time direct

6. A Trustee may at any time by writing under his hand resign his office but shall execute a proper Deed of Retirement from any trust for sale.

7. THE general management and control of the Charity for the purpose of carrying out the primary trust aforesaid shall be vested in the Committee and (without prejudice to the generality of their powers) they shall have power to do all or any of the following things that is to say:

- (i) To enter into contract to borrow money ✓
- (ii) To appoint officers and servants at such remuneration (if any) as they think fit
- (iii) To receive grants donations and subscriptions ✓
- (iv) To make such rules and regulations from time to time for the management and conduct of any premises or otherwise as they think fit
- (v) To remove or appoint new Trustees of this Deed or of such Conveyances and Assignments as aforesaid but so that in relation to such Conveyance and Assignment a Deed of Appointment or Retirement to carry out such appointment or removal shall be executed

The number of Trustees shall be three ✓

8. PROPER books of accounts shall be kept on behalf of the Trustees and entry made therein of all receipts and payments and such accounts shall be audited annually by a qualified Chartered Accountant to be selected by the Committee ✓

9. THE Committee shall be elected and its meetings regulated in accordance with the provisions contained in the schedule hereto

10. IF upon the winding up of the Lewisham Polish Centre there remains any property the same shall be given to Pitsford College for Polish Girls or to some other institution or association of persons of Polish extraction having objects similar to the objects of the Lewisham Polish Centre such institution or association to be determined by the Committee at or before the

time of winding up dissolution or in default thereof by the decision of the Polish Parish Lewisham Brockley or the Polish Community (South London) Association Ltd. PROVIDED ALWAYS that notwithstanding anything herein contained no property shall be distributed to anybody or institution whose objects are not solely charitable as defined by the Charities Act 1960

I N W I T N E S S whereof the parties hereto have set their hands and seals the day and year first above written

S C H E D U L E

1. The said Monsignor Adam Wrobel Zygmunt Szkopiak and Waldemar Marian Ceglowski and the 13 other members (listed on Page 1) shall be the first members of the Committee
2. Vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by way of resolution of the Committee
3. Meetings of the Committee are to be held quarterly and an annual meeting of the Lewisham Polish Centre to be held within two months of the end of the financial year. Special meetings of the Committee can be held at any time upon the proposal of four of the members of the Committee or two of the Trustees
4. Ten days notice is to be given to the members of the Committee before any meeting and an agenda of the matters to be put before them and three weeks notice is to be given for the General Meeting of the Lewisham Polish Centre
5. Nine members of the Committee shall form a quorum for the Committee meetings and thirty three members of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall form a quorum for the Annual General Meeting and if no quorum is present the meeting shall be adjourned for half an hour and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present the members present shall be a quorum
6. The First Chairman of the Committee to be Mr. J.M. Makulski and the first Secretary of the Committee to be Mr. J.S. Miziniak both appointed annually
7. All persons of Polish extraction and their relatives residing within the area of the Polish Parish Lewisham Brockley (as defined at the time of the execution of this Deed) shall be

eligible for membership of the Lewisham Polish Centre. All members shall observe all provisions herein contained and regulations in force for the time being and further the aims of the Lewisham Polish Centre and any person who in the opinion of the Committee acts contrary to these provisions can be deprived of membership by the unanimous decision or suspended by a majority decision of the Committee present at the meeting. Such member shall have a right of appeal to the General Meeting.

8. Membership of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall be coextensive to membership of the Polish Parish Lewisham Brockley as defined above.

9. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of the members of the Committee shall be thirteen and three Trustees and every year ² one third of the Committee (or the nearest to it) of that year shall retire by rotation. All retiring members may offer themselves for re-election. The retiring Committee shall remain in office until dissolution of the meeting at which the Committee for the following year is elected.

RESOLUTION NO. 1

In the best interest of the Charity, the Trustees hereby resolve, under section 275 of the Charities Act 2011, to modify charitable purposes to the Lewisham Polish Centres' Governing Document, dated: 20th of the November 1972 ("Declaration of Trust Deed"), in order to reinforce effectiveness of the Charity.

At present Clause 1 - page 2 & 3 of the Declaration of Trust Deed reads:

" The Trustees hereby declare that they and the survivors or survivor of them or other Trustees or Trustee hereof of the time being will hold the said sum so subscribed as aforesaid when the same shall be paid to them and all other subscription donations and bequests and others moneys or property as and when the same shall be paid to or vested in them and the moneys investments and property from time to time representing the same Upon Trust to apply the same in accordance with the provision hereinafter contained for charitable purposes for the benefit of persons of Polish extraction (which shall be deemed to be persons who were born in Poland or one of whose parents or grandparents were born in Poland or person who are or were married (a) to a person who was born in Poland or (b) to a person one or whose parents or grandparents where born in Poland) and their relatives (hereinafter called the "beneficiaries") residing permanently or temporarily in the London postal aeriels of South East 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 13, 14, 15, 18, 12, 21, 23, 24, 26 and 27 being the area of the Polish Parish of Lewisham - Brockley (as at the time of execution of this Deed).

- (1) The relief and assistance of the aged, sick and disabled beneficiaries.
- (2) The advancement of the education of persons resident in the said Parish.
- (3) The relief of poverty amongst the beneficiaries.
- (4) The advancement of the Roman Catholic faith and Roman Catholic charitable institutions.

In furtherance of the above objects but not further or otherwise The Trustees shall have the following powers:-

- (a) To make provision for the maintenance of any school or other education institution situate in the said Parish.
- (b) To provide scholarship for further education , such scholarship to be awarded to persons resident in the Parish.
- (c) To provide lectures and films of an education character for the benefit of persons resident in the said Parish.
- (d) To do all such other things as will further the above objects or any of them."

The Trustees advice, that the Lewisham Polish Centre and the Local Polish Catholic Mission in Lewisham – Brockley (which replaced the Polish Parish of Lewisham - Brockley), are two independent institution.

The Lewisham Polish Centre activities were expanded to whole of South - East London and The Trustees believe, that the widening of the area for the benefit of persons of Polish extraction and their relatives is necessary. The Trustees believe, that the Charity has access to the necessary resources to carry out this wider object without detriment to any existing beneficiaries.

It is now agreed by the Trustees, that Clause 1 of the Lewisham Polish Centre Declaration of Trust Deed shall be amended, as it will compliment and form part of the Lewisham Polish Centre existing Governing Document and shall provide as follows:

“The Trustees hereby declare, that they and survivors of them or other Trustees or Trustee hereof of the time being, will hold the said sum so subscribed as aforesaid when the same shall be paid to them and all other subscriptions donations and bequest and other moneys or property as when and the same shall be paid to or vested in them and the moneys investments and property from time to time, representing the same Upon Trust to apply the same in accordance with the provision hereinafter contained for charitable purposes for the benefit of persons of Polish extraction and their relatives living in South – East London, (hereinafter called “the Beneficiaries”).

The main objectives of trust are:-

- (1) The relief and assistance to the aged, sick and disabled Beneficiaries.
- (2) To assist Beneficiaries and their children to acquire a better education, both in the British and the Polish education systems, including learning the Polish language learning about Polish culture and customs.
- (3) The relief of poverty amongst Beneficiaries.
- (4) The advancement of the Roman Catholic faith and Roman Catholic charitable institution.

In furtherance of the above objects, but not further or otherwise, the Trustees shall have the following powers:-

- (a) To assist in the maintenance of Polish language School for children and English language courses for adults, situate in the Lewisham Polish Centre.
- (b) To support further education for people of Polish origin living in South – East London.
- (c) To organise lectures, events and meetings to celebrate national anniversaries.
- (d) To support the teaching of the Roman–Catholic religion to children in Polish language.
- (e) To do all such other things as will further the above objects or any of them.”

Table of changes in Clause 1 is as follows:

1. The definitions of Lewisham Polish Centre Beneficiaries were simplified and now they include any people of Polish decent and their families. The Charity activities were expanded to the entirety of South - East London.
2. In item (2) main objectives of the Charity, the assistance in obtaining better education was expanded to include the British education system.
3. The powers of Trustees were amended and updated:
 - 3a. the old item (a) was removed and a new item (a) was added to upgrade it in line with revised item (2), the main objectives of the Charity.
 - 3b. the old item (b) was amended in order to adapt it to current financial capacity of the Charity.
 - 3c. the old item (c) was removed and replaced with a new item (c), which extends the scope of activities of the Trustees contained in the old item (c) .
 - 3d. a new item (d) was added.
 - 3e. item (e) is now where old item (d) used to be.

RESOLUTION NO. 2

In the best interest of the Charity, the Trustees hereby resolve, under section 275 of the Charities Act 2011, to make changes, to the dissolution clause, to the Lewisham Polish Centres' Governing Document dated: 20th of the November 1972 ("Declaration of Trust Deed") in order to reinforce the effectiveness of the Charity.

At the present Clause 10 – page 5&6 of the Declaration of Trust Deed reads:

"If upon the winding up of the Lewisham Polish Centre there remains any property the same shall be given to Pitsford College for Polish Girls or to some other institution association of persons of Polish extraction having objects similar to the objects of the Lewisham Polish Centre , such institution or association to be determined by the Committee at or before the time of winding up dissolution or in default thereof by the decision of the Polish Parish Lewisham - Brockley or the Polish Community (South London) Association Ltd.

Provided always that notwithstanding anything herein contained no property shall be distributed to anybody or institution whose objects are not solely charitable as defined by the Charities Act 1960."

To the Trustees knowledge current Beneficiary of the Lewisham Polish Centre assets in case of winding up of the Lewisham Polish Centre, namely Pitsford College for Polish Girls was wound up in 1989 and should therefore no longer appear in the Trust Deed of Lewisham Polish Centre.

The Trustees believe that the decision regarding division of the Lewisham Polish Centre assets, should belong exclusively to then, the Committee of the Lewisham Polish Centre.

It is now agreed by the Trustees, that Clause 10 of the Declaration of Trust Deed shall be amended as it will compliment and form part of the Lewisham Polish Centre existing Governing Document and shall provide as follows:

"The Lewisham Polish Centre may be wound up if it is no longer able to achieve its objectives as hereinbefore set out.

In this eventuality at least two Trustees must prepare a submission to the Committee requesting that the Lewisham Polish Centre be wound up and giving reasons therefore. Should the Committee support this request the Committee shall call a General Meeting of Lewisham Polish Centre members who will determine

whether or not the Lewisham Polish Centre should be wound up, by a majority not less than two thirds of the Lewisham Polish Centre members entitled to attend and vote at the Lewisham Polish Centre General Meeting.

In the event that the Trustees' submission for the winding up of the Lewisham Polish Centre should be rejected by the General Meeting, then the members at the Lewisham Polish Centre General Meeting shall appoint a new Committee which will be charged with the duty to develop a plan to enable the Lewisham Polish Centre to continue its activities.

In the event that the Lewisham Polish Centre General Meeting decides that the Lewisham Polish Centre should be wound up, such a winding up process shall be carried out in accordance with the provisions of the Charities Act 2011."


In the event of such winding up, such assets of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall be divided between such charities as the Committee members shall decide and whose activities are similar to those of the Lewisham Polish Centre and whose Beneficiaries are people of Polish decent."

RESOLUTION No. 3

In the best interest of the Charity, the Trustees hereby resolve, under section 280 of the Charities Act 2011, to make administrative changes to the Lewisham Polish Centres' Governing Document dated: 20th of the November 1972 ("Declaration of Trust Deed") in order to reinforce effectiveness of the Charity.

It is now agreed by the Trustees of the Lewisham Polish Centre, that Declaration of the Trust Deed shall be amended as it will complement and form parts of the Lewisham Polish Centre existing Governing Document.

1. At present Clause 8 - page 5 reads:

"Proper books of accounts shall be kept on behalf of the Trustees and entry made therein of all receipts and payments and such accounts shall be audited annually by a qualified Chartered Account to be selected by the Committee."

It is now agreed by the Trustees, that Clause 8 be amended to read:

"The Treasurer of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall work together with the Trustees, keep proper books of account and of all entries made therein and of all receipts and payments. Such books of account shall be audited annually by a qualified Chartered Accountant to be appointed by the Committee of the Lewisham Polish Centre. The accounts will be maintained in accordance with the guidelines, set out by the Charity Commission of England & Wales regulating the activities of charities."

2. At the present Clause 4 – page 6 reads:

"Ten days' notice is to be given to the members of the Committee before any meeting and an agenda of the matters to be put before them and three weeks' notice is to be given for the General Meeting of the Lewisham Polish Centre."

It is now agreed by Trustees, that Clause 4 be amended to read:

"Seven days' notice is to be given to the members of the Committee before any Committee Meeting and any agenda of the matters to be put before them and fourteen days' notice is to be given to the members for a General Meeting of the Lewisham Polish Centre members."

3. At present Clause 5 – page 6 reads:

“Nine members of the Lewisham Polish Centre Committee shall form a quorum for the Committee meetings and thirty three members of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall form a quorum for the Annual General Meeting and if no quorum is present the meeting shall be adjourned for half an hour and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present , the members present shall be a quorum.”

It is now agreed by the Trustees, that Clause 5 be amended to read:

“Two thirds of members of the Lewisham Polish Centre Committee shall form a quorum for the Committee meetings and one fourth of members of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall form a quorum for the Annual General Meeting and if no quorum is present for either a committee meeting or a General Meeting, then the meeting shall be adjourned for half-an-hour and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, the members present shall be a quorum.”

4. At present Clause 7 – page 6&7 reads:

“All persons of Polish extraction and their relatives residing within the area of the Polish Parish Lewisham - Brockley (as defined at the time of the execution of this Deed) shall be eligible for membership of the Lewisham Polish Centre. All members shall observe all provision herein contained and regulations in force for the time being and further the aims of the Lewisham Polish Centre and any person who in the opinion of the Committee acts contrary to these provisions can be deprived of membership by the unanimous decision or suspended by a majority decision of the Committee present at the meeting. Such member shall have right of appeal to the General Meeting.”

It is now agreed by the Trustees, that Clause 7 be amended to read:

“All persons of Polish extraction and their relatives residing within the area of South – East London, shall be eligible for membership of the Lewisham Polish Centre. All members shall observe all provisions herein contained and regulations in force for the time being and further the aims of the Lewisham Polish Centre. Any person who in the reasonable opinion of the Committee, acts contrary to those provisions or regulations, may be deprived of membership by the unanimous decision or suspended by a majority decision of the Committee present at the meeting. Such member shall have the right of appeal to the Annual General Meeting.”

5. At the present Clause 9 - page 7 reads:

“Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting the member of the members of the Committee shall be thirteen and three Trustees and every year on third of the Committee (or the nearest to it) of that year shall retire by rotation . All retiring member may offer themselves for re-election. The retiring Committee shall remain in office until dissolution of the meeting at which the Committee for the following year is elected.”

Is it now agreed by Trustees, that Clause 9 be amended to read:

"Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting of the Lewisham Polish Centre the Committee of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall consist of three Trustees and thirteen further Committee members. The holding Trustees appointment is permanent.

The remaining Committee members shall be appointed for a period of three years and upon the expiry of this period shall retire but may seek re-election.


The retiring Committee shall remain in office until the dissolution of the meeting at which the Committee for the following year is elected."

Lewisham Polish Centre (charity No. 264998) ("the Charity")

RESOLUTION NO. 4

In the best interest of the Charity, the Trustees hereby resolve, under section 280 of the Charities Act 2011, to make administrative changes to the Lewisham Polish Centres' Governing Document dated: 20th of the November 1972 ("Declaration of Trust Deed") in order to reinforce the effectiveness of the Charity.

At the present Clause 8 – page 7 of the Declaration of Trust Deed reads:

"The membership of the Lewisham Polish Centre shall be coextensive to membership of the Polish Parish Lewisham Brockley as defined above."

The Trustees advice, that the Lewisham Polish Centre and the Local Polish Catholic Mission in Lewisham – Brockley (which replaced the Polish Parish of Lewisham – Brockley), are two independent institutions. The decision on membership in the Local Polish Catholic Mission in Lewisham – Brockley lies exclusively within competence of the Polish Parish Priest.

Therefore the membership in these two separate Charities can no longer be coextensive.

The Lewisham Polish Centre Trustees concur that Declaration of Membership is essential in governing of the Centre and should therefore form part of the Trust Deed.

It is now agreed by the Trustees of the Lewisham Polish Centre, that Clause 8 of the Declaration of Trust Deed, should be deleted .

A new Clause 8 shall be inserted into the Declaration of Trust Deed, as will compliment and form part of the Lewisham Polish Centre existing Governing Document and shall provide as follows:

"To become a member of the Lewisham Polish Centre the applicant must be recommended by a member of the Committee. The applicant will sign a declaration form supplied by the Lewisham Polish Centre and agree to pay an annual membership fee.

The membership application shall be presented to the Committee for approval. Once approved, membership is valid for one year from the date of acceptance by the Lewisham Polish Centre Committee and may thereafter be renewed from year to year by paying the annual membership fee.

The membership fee will be set by the Lewisham Polish Centre Committee.
